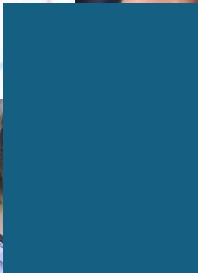
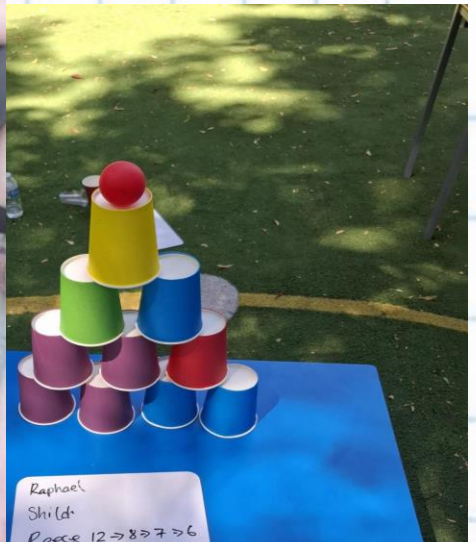
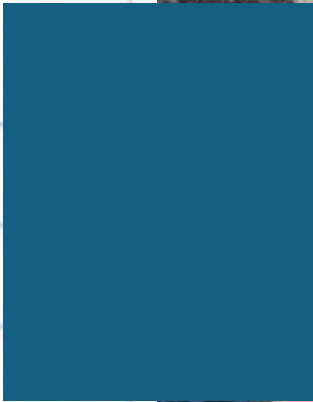
Our yearly **Garden Party** was a real highlight — pupils loved it, and it was wonderful catching up with pupils and staff who left over the past year.

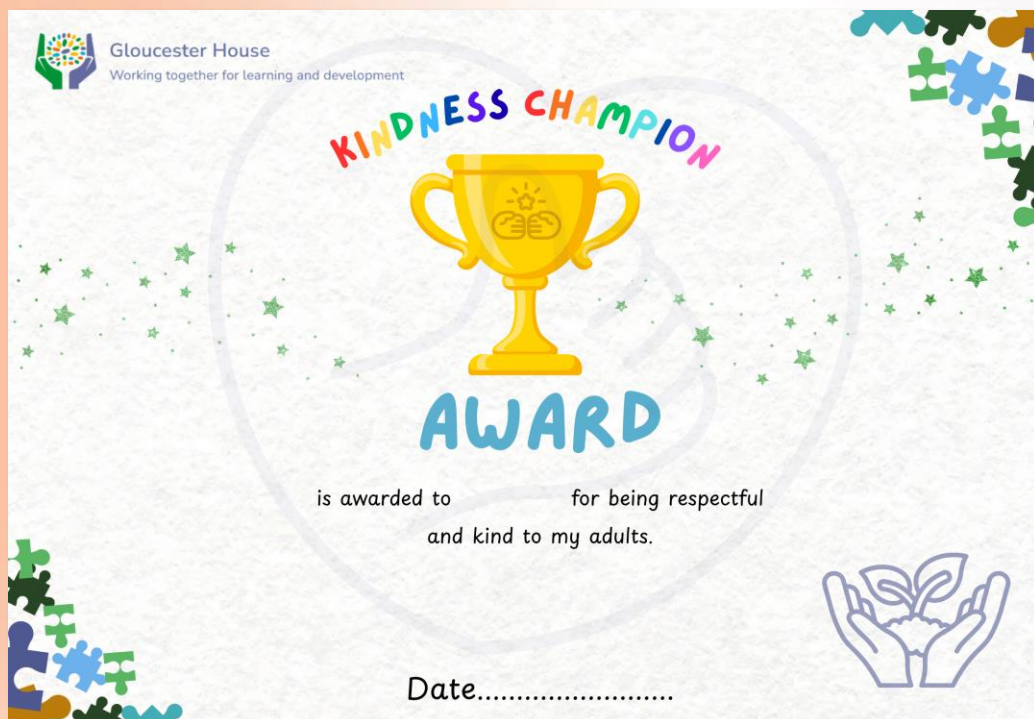
Attendance last week
