Message from Headteacher

Dear GH Community,

It has been another busy week at Gloucester House, with lots happening across the school.

They have had opportunities to interview candidates, share their views and take part in activities planned and delivered by candidates.

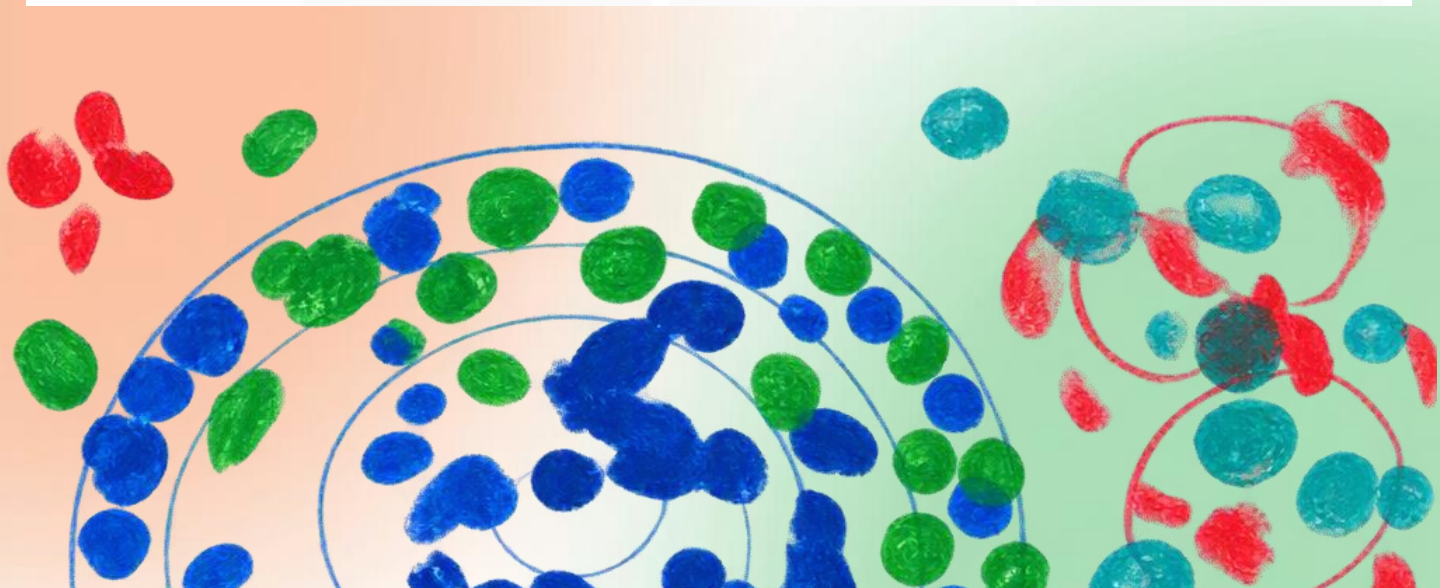

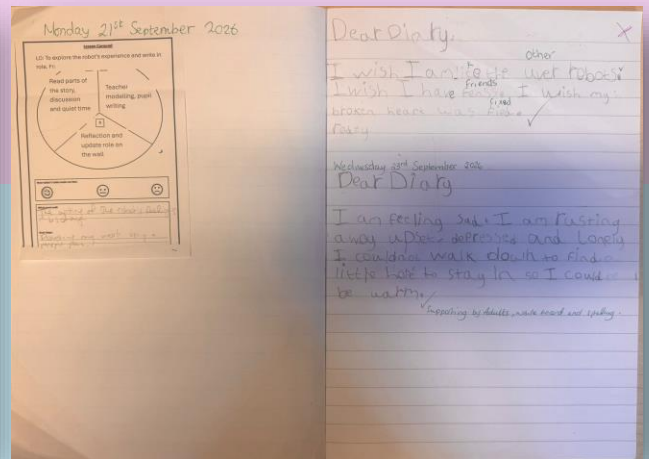
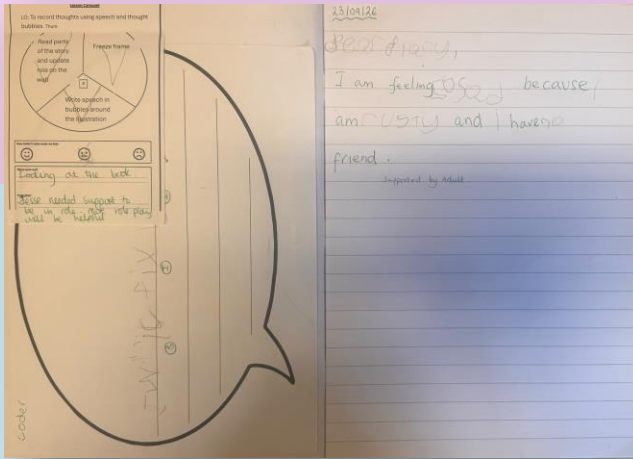


Workshare

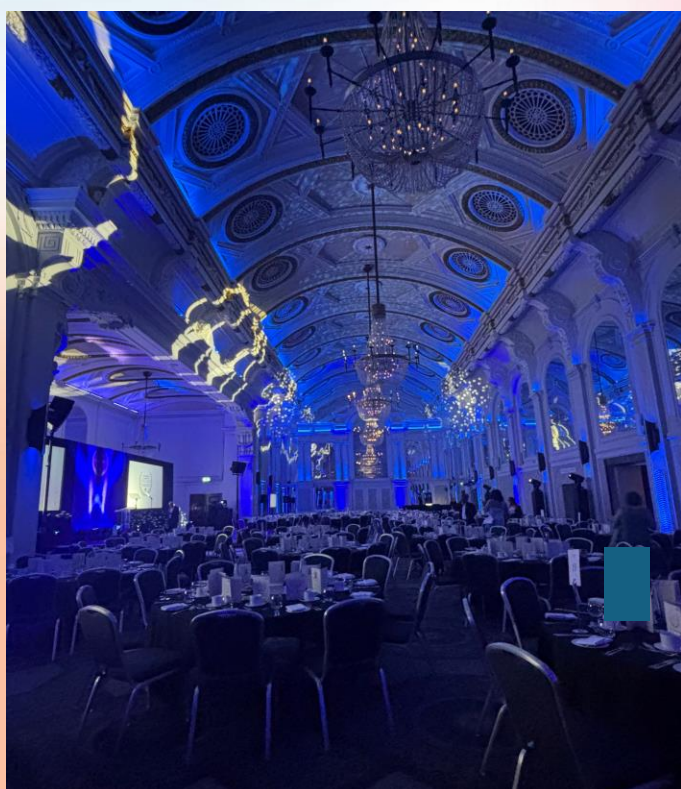
